Reports he hasn't eaten a full meal in the past month and claims, "I am just not hungry." He snacks on crackers and chips throughout the day. He explains eating alone is an unsatisfying experience. The client is angry and wants to leave without medical attention. Discussed the benefits and risks of leaving versus staying. He states he is willing to be assessed.

- Gastroesophageal reflux disease
- Glaucoma

Surgical History:

Medication Reconciliation:

- Bimatoprost 1 drop of 0.03% solution in the evening
- Tamsulosin 0.4 mg by mouth at bedtime with a snack
- Docusate sodium 50 mg by mouth at bedtime
- Famotidine 20 mg by mouth daily (client states ran out of this a while ago)
- Acetaminophen 325-650 mg by mouth as needed for "aches and pains"
