1. Respiratory	Patient breathing is labored. Asymmetrical chest expansion anteriorly and posteriorly, no visible abnormal findings on inspection. Vesicular breath sounds auscultated anteriorly and posteriorly at right and left upper lobes, and right middle lobe anteriorly and posteriorly	Bowel obstruction: Abdominal bloating affects the diaphragm and makes breathing difficult. The pressure in the abdomen may be enough to restrict the movement of the diaphragm, leading to asymmetrical chest expansion. Gastroparesis: Gastroparesis is a digestive problem that causes difficulty breathing. The condition also makes it difficult for the stomach to empty its contents. People feel nauseated and full after eating. It also leads to abdominal pain due to the reduced digestive motility. Celiac disease: celiac disease causes symptoms such as difficulty breathing due to increased heart rate. The condition also causes bloating and irritability, leading to abdominal pain. Celiac disease may cause chest tightness and coughing, in some cases.
