CC	30-year-old female presents with adnominal pain	
Body System	Column A	Column B
Cardiovascular	Equal and strong pulses throughout the body noted, no visible or palpable lifts or heaves on chest inspection, clear and distinct S1 and S2 heart sounds with no murmurs heard upon auscultation, and brisk capillary refill noted.	Aneurysm: Pulsating mass in the abdominal abdomen cough and shortness of breath. Myocardial Infarction: Chest pai pressure, shortness of breath, sweating, dizzy indigestion. Pericarditis: Sharp, pleuritic ches radiating to the neck, malaise, and dyspnea.
Genitourinary	Absence of pain of discomfort with urination, normal urinary frequency and flow, no sign of retention, no flank pain or tenderness while palpating and normal kidney palpation with only lower pole of the right kidney noted.	UTI: Painful urination, urinary fr urgency, fatigued and chills. Kidney stone: Flank pain, CVA t hematuria, and dysuria. PID: Lower abdominal tenderness fever, inv dysuria, and adnexal fullness.
Gastrointestinal	Abdomen is tender, with nausea and vomiting present, hypoactive bowel sounds heard, but no masses palpable. Severe pain upon palpitation to right side. Guarding is present.	Cholecystitis: Rebound tenderness guarding upper abdominal pain noted with a posit Mu Irritable Bowel Syndrome (IBS): Abdominal pain, altered bowel habits, and tendern Pancreatitis: Persistent abdominal epigastric shoulder or back, nausea and vo decreased b
Lymphatic	Lymph nodes palpable, moveable, small and non-tender, no swelling, no asymmetry, no discoloration and temperature is equal bilaterally.	Lymphoma: swelling of lymph n groin or n shortness of breath and fatigue.
